for individual or full session submissions

READ THIS BEFORE YOU START!

- Prepare your proposal before you submit. Use the worksheets available at <u>www.mpactmobility.org/speakers</u>
- 2. Be sure to include the "so what" of your topic or project: why it matters and lessons learned.
- 3. Each proposer is limited to 2 proposals.
- 4. For full session proposals, you must contact speakers you want to include to make sure they are interested and able to attend the conference.
- 5. Once your proposal is ready to submit, it will take 30+ minutes to complete the submission form. ALERT: If you leave the form without submitting at the end, the form will time out and you will have to start over.
- 6. Once you hit submit, you will receive a confirmation keep this! You CAN log back in to edit your proposal up to the submission deadline of midnight, Pacific Standard Time, March 21.
- 7. Make sure you can be in Portland, October 26-29. If you are asked to participate in a session, you will be expected to be there in person. Speakers can attend for free the day they speak or register and pay for the full conference.

We greatly appreciate your best thinking! At Mpact, our content is highly curated to ensure the strongest content and the variety of perspectives required for success in any community. We may accept your proposal as is, or we may mix and match with other proposals. We may also ask that one or two people from a proposal participate. It's unusual that we accept full submissions (aka group proposals) as submitted.



EVALUATION CRITERIA

We look for proposals that reflect or advance:

- Cross-sector viewpoints:

 from different
 industries/sectors,
 geographies, perspectives
 and backgrounds.
- Innovative stories that have lessons learned.
 Why did or didn't it work?
- Community perspective, especially underrepresented or hard to reach populations.
- Innovative partnerships and collaborative solutions.
- Real-world, communityderived, practical applications to solving problems.

What happens after you submit

Planning the Mpact Transit + Community Conference

The <u>Mpact National Steering Committee</u> guides content for the conference. Steering Committee members work in communities across the United States and Canada. They helped develop the Call for Speakers and will review proposals as part of curating sessions for the conference.

The Mpact Innovators, a national networking group welcoming the next generation of industry leaders and thinkers, organizes the Mpact PK Slam (powered by PechaKucha™) and other conference activities. View past PK Slam presentations here on Mpact's YouTube channel.

April

After the Call for Speakers closes, proposals will be read, sorted and ranked by members of the Mpact National Steering Committee (NSC).

May

The full National Steering Committee will meet to discuss proposals and curate topics and sessions. Individual NSC members will choose specific sessions to coordinate. NSC coordinators may reach out to you about your proposal.

June

The full National Steering Committee will meet again to review and vet proposed conference sessions. This is a back and forth process, involving critique of individual sessions and the program as a whole. Speakers and topics may be adjusted at this point.

July

National Steering Committee members will reach out to confirm speakers for sessions and confirm the content to be covered. Speakers will meet with their NSC session coordinator and other participants at least twice - once in July and again prior to the conference.

August

All proposers will receive a final decision on their submittal by August.
